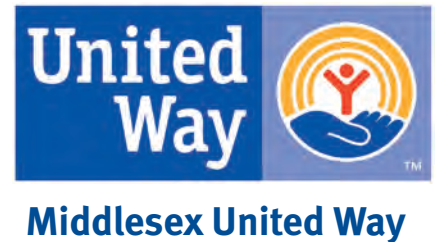


DON'T JUST WEAR THE SHIRT, LIVE IT.



WHAT DOES \$52 PROVIDE? HOW JUST \$1 MORE PER WEEK CAN HELP.

- › Lunch for seven families participating in parenting classes at Middletown Adult Education's Even Start Family Literacy program.
- › One counseling visit at the Middlesex Hospital Perinatal Program to ensure that pregnant women and new parents have access to medical care.
- › Participation for a child with intellectual disabilities in MARC: Community Resources' Saturday Recreation program.
- › 208 meals at Shoreline Soup Kitchens & Pantries.
- › Two months of tutoring for a student studying to learn English at Literacy Volunteers-Valley Shore, CT.
- › Round-trip transportation for two veterans to the West Haven VA Hospital by St. Luke's Eldercare Solutions of Central CT.
- › A preventive dental visit for an uninsured child that includes cleaning, x-rays, fluoride, and sealants at the Community Health Center's Mobile Dental program.
- › One week of before- and after-school care for a child from a low-income family at the Northern Middlesex YMCA.
- › Membership subsidies for four economically disadvantaged girls to participate in scouting with Girl Scouts of America.
- › One week of healthy snacks for the six Neighborhood Troupes at Oddfellows Playhouse.
- › The training of one volunteer at the American Red Cross on how to respond when help is needed due to a fire, flooding, or any incident that would displace a person or family from their home.
- › Participation for two children in Durham-Middlefield Youth & Family Services' summer Reading for Pleasure program.
- › A hot meal every day for a month at St. Vincent dePaul Place in Middletown.

What Does \$52 Provide? Continued

- › Ten counseling sessions with a licensed clinical social worker for a child from a low-income family at East Haddam Youth & Family Services.
- › A Parent Advocacy workshop with free child care for participants at the Westbrook Public Schools' Early Childhood Council.
- › Two hours of individualized assistance to a local Youth Service Bureau director in support of youth sponsored initiatives at Rushford.
- › 3.5 hours of job placement assistance from Kuhn Employment Opportunities for a person living with mental illness.
- › Bus rides to job interviews for 41 clients of the United Labor Agency.
- › Two hours of advocate time for a survivor of sexual assault at Women & Families Center.
- › One year of registration costs and program materials for a youth to participate in scouting with the Boy Scouts of America, Connecticut Rivers Council.
- › A 90-minute intensive in-home clinical counseling session for a child who is at-risk of being removed from the home for psychiatric hospitalization or residential treatment through Child & Family Agency of Southeastern CT.
- › A 30-minute clinical counseling session or one medication management session for a client of Gilead Community Services' Middletown Outpatient Clinic.
- › Four hours of babysitting time so that mothers can participate in substance abuse treatment without interruption at The Connection.
- › Innumerable nails, screws, bolts, and brackets that are required to build or rehab a Habitat for Humanity house.

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
